# **Show Rules & Definitions**

#### 1. Authority of Show Marshal

The Show Marshal is in charge of the show at all times. Any matters of dispute shall be referred to the Show Marshal for his / her decision, which will be final. The Show Marshal has the authority to delegate his / her duties to other persons.

- 2. Show Staging: Thursday 10am to 1:00pm.
  Trading table Staging: Thursday 10am to 2pm
  and Saturday 8am-10am. Plants will not be
  accepted out of these hours without prior
  arrangements with the Show Marshal. The Show
  Marshal shall direct where all exhibits are to be
  staged.
- 3. Plants may be entered in **one class only**. Plants entered in incorrect classes will be disqualified and will not be judged or placed. Plants must be entered on the official entry card provided. Where insufficient entries occur, classes may be combined

- or deleted where appropriate. Sub classes may also be added if needed.
- 4. **Identification of plants.** Owner's name should be on tie tags obtained from the Show Marshal.
- 5. **Awards.** Exhibitors may nominate plants for awards by applying to the Show Marshal for special tags *before judging*. Exhibitors who nominate their own plants are bound to accept any awards, if given.
- 6. Only the Show Marshal, judges, associate judges, stewards & the official photographer may be present during judging.
- 7. Only **flowering plants** will be judged. Plants are judged on flower quality unless otherwise stated. 75% of the flowers should be fully open on any one spike, except for sequential flowering plants.

- 8. **Cut spikes** are eligible for trophies, prizes or awards if exhibitor resides over 80km from the show. Cymbidiums under 60mm, specimen plants and first flowering seedlings do not apply.
- 9. **Specimen plant.** A *single* plant of unusual size & number of flowers for the variety, exhibiting fine culture but not necessarily quality.
- 10. **Novice.** An exhibitor is classed as a novice until three first prizes (including trophies) have been won against other exhibitors at any recognised orchid show. Novice exhibitors are not bound to enter under this class. They may if they wish enter open classes.
- 11. **Club Trading table.** Only for the sale of orchid plants, orchid flasks, sphagnum moss, Spanish moss, fertiliser, orchid mixes and pots. Financial members of the Waitakere Orchid Club (Inc) who exhibit at the show are entitled to supply items to a maximum of \$600 (before commission is deducted) for sale on the trading table. Those with sales stalls in the show are not allowed to sell on the trading table.
- 12. Members selling on the trading table must apply for a vendor code from the Show Marshal. They must be exhibitors or be available to assist with any duties during the show period. The price & vendor's code must be clearly shown on official trading table labels attached to sale items. A list of sales items on the official form must be provided to the Show Marshal.

  20% (Twenty per cent) commission will be charged for all sales. The Show Marshal, will allocate priority in the event of over supply.
- 13. The trading table will close 3pm on Saturday. Sellers must be present or arrange to have unsold plants collected after the final checking has been completed at the conclusion of the show. The club will not accept any responsibility for uncollected plants.
- 14. **Plants & containers.** Exhibitors & vendors of plants must have containers & plants clean & free from scale, virus or any other disease. Diseased plants will not be allowed to be sold on the trading table, and will be disqualified from judging. Plants must be firm in the pot.

Plants with few or no roots will not be allowed to be sold on the trading table.

Plants that are not in **show condition** will not be judged and will be disqualified from winning prizes. The show marshal in consultation with the judging panel shall decide if any plants were to be disqualified for this reason.

15. All displays (including baskets) must list the number of plants that are to be judged in each class. The list must be given to the Show Marshal before 1:00pm on Thursday, 27<sup>th</sup> August 2015.

- 16. All trophies and classes are judged for plants of any size and any colour, unless specified otherwise.
- 17. **Plant measurements** are made across the flower petals or sepals, at the widest part. The majority of open flowers are expected to fit within the size specified for the class. A few flowers are allowed to be marginally outside the size limits.
- 18. **Colour** refers to the dominant colour of the flower, primarily of the sepals and petals. The colour of spots and stripes will only be considered if they dominate the colour of the flower. The labellum may be a different colour.
- 19. **Prize money** to be collected on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> August at the close of the show, any money not collected shall be deemed to be a donation to the Waitakere Orchid Club
- 20. Species plants may be natural species
  (according to the Kew checklist of selected
  plant families) or line bred. Natural hybrids are
  not considered species.
  Hybrid means a plant having more than one
  species in its parentage.
- 21. **Australasian** hybrid Dendrobium must predominantly have one or more Australian native species in the breeding.
- 22. **Cluster Type Cattleya** must have 5 or more flowers produced in a tight umbel at the top of the inflorescence.
- 23. Orchids must predominate in all displays. Greenery and other non-flowering plants, or plants with insignificant flowers may be used to enhance displays. Displays should either be table top or floor up to 2m x 3m, unless arranged otherwise with the Show Marshall prior to show setup.
- 24. The show marshal shall decide who are exhibitors.
- 25. Should a plant entered in the Un-named class be later identified, the show marshal may elect to move the plant to the appropriate class.
