NATIONAL JUDGING SEMINAR and ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Auckland Orchid Club will be hosting the AGM of the Orchid Council of New Zealand this year over Queen's Birthday weekend.

The AGM will be held in the Sunderland Lounge in the Hobsonville Air Base on Sunday morning 4th June.

In conjunction with the AGM the Council will be holding a National Judging Seminar. For the Judging Seminar, obviously we will need flowering plants which we hope members will be able to supply.

The set up for these plants will be Friday night 2nd June.

I do not have a programme for the seminar, but I have always found these weekends very interesting.

The judges are put through various exercises, group discussions and listen to lectures on many different subjects. This year one of the lecturers will be Mike Harrison from Australia, no doubt discussing Australian native orchids.

If you wish to attend the AGM on Sunday morning there will be no charge, however you must let Lee or Roy know in advance, so as your name can be included on the 'guest' list to allow access to the Air Base.

The cost for full registration is \$65.00. This includes morning and afternoon teas, lunches both days and a dinner at the Wings Restaurant, Hobson Motor Inn on Saturday night.

If you are not a full registrant but would like to attend the dinner on Saturday night, this will be \$35.00.

To attend the proceedings on Saturday and/ or Sunday the cost will be \$12.50 per day which includes morning and afternoon teas plus lunch.

As I mentioned on Club night "If there is anyone interested in billeting people over this weekend I would appreciate a call just in case we have any surprises closer to the time".
