# GUEST SPEAKER APRIL MEETING Antal Kolocsai

We had our very own Antal talk to us on his succulents and *lithops*.

I have always been fascinated by these extraordinary little plants and was looking forward to hearing all about them.

Antal has a wonderful collection of these mesebryanthemaceae of which there are approx 1700 species. They are unique little plants and are usually very tiny. About 5000 endemic species grow in the coastal deserts of South Africa. The Atlantic Ocean creates fog and mist which give moisture but it is still a very dry area which only receives about 100mm of rain annually. In their natural habitat only the tops of the plants can be seen above the sandy, rocky terrain.

We have to adjust conditions to grow them successfully. I was surprised to hear that they do their growing in our winter. Watering is crucial just a wee bit every 2 weeks. They can be grown on a windowsill but care must be taken so they don't burn and they must have air movement.

The accompanying Power Point show was magnificent. The size and colours of the flowers were incredible. Antal showed us how easy it was to propagate these mesembs by seed. They apparently will germinate in about 3 days – given the right conditions.

Thanks Antal for the wonderful talk. I will look after my 'new babies' with great care and hope they survive! ED.
