# MESSAGE OF THE MONTH

By the time you receive this newsletter, ANZAC day would have passed and day by day the temperatures are beginning to drop, particularly at night.

This is the time to take the extra shading off the greenhouse and move frost tender orchids to a more comfortable position.

Watering for some plants must be reduced.

When watering from now and through the winter, choose your watering times carefully. Water in the mornings, being careful that leaves remain dry. Water sitting in the centre of plants or on leaves could cause rot. If its a dull, dreary, wet day - don't water, nor if a frost is due that night.
