Orchid names written in *italics* and in lower case depicts it is a *species*.

The plant commentary was conducted by Dennis.

We discussed **Lito's** Phalaenopsis and Oncidium.

Grahame's Miltonia - a magnificent specimen growing reasonably cool with lots of water during summer and in a shady spot with good air movement.

Shirley's Phragmipedium - South American slipper orchid grown from a flask she brought into NZ. She also had a Coelogyne which grows in the shade house.

William and Man brought in a Paphiopedilum species from Thailand which was flowered 4 years from flask.

Dennis showed his Stenoglottis orchid which dies down in winter. It is grown in potting mix and pumice.


