DRY BLOOD TIME!

February is dry blood time for cymbidium **seedlings.** Soak the blood in a large container for two or three days and discard the blood package and use only the liquid left behind.

The blood liquid is the booster. This encourages initiation of growths at the right time to develop before winter. It takes 6 weeks for the blood to activate and put up a new growth. Next year it will 'take off' and produce a spike.

Don't put the blood powder on the plants as it encourages pollen cap mite.

Hurry, as it is nearly March!

Sarcochilus Culture — Wolf Grausch

Wolf kindly gave us an impromptu talk on what to do with our sarcochilus for this time of the year.

We need to repot them in No3 bark.

If the roots seem to have climbed up the stalk, cut the plant back and repot them.

Repot each year or at a pinch every 2 years. Some newer species seem to like a bit more light.

Feed and water at this time of the year regularly. Water in the morning or if not possible, no later than 5pm. They like lots at the moment. (summer daylight saving time).

In the winter water only once a week.

Make sure they have plenty of air movement.
