<u>Culture Notes for Reed Stemmed</u> <u>Epidendrums.</u>

These plants are easy to grow and very rewarding as they flower continuously from Oct -Feb and longer.

Water: Over summer we tend to allow them to get <u>nearly</u> dry and then water (and feed) but don't keep them soggy wet, and don't stand them in a saucer of water. In winter water once plants are dry, about every 1-2 weeks is generally sufficient. If possible water in the morning.

Fertiliser: Each time we water over summer we feed at the same time, we use a variety of readily available fertilisers but at only ½ the strength recommended on the label. We stop feeding over winter. Don't forget to apply calcium once a month for cell health.

Light: Bright filtered light with approximately 50% shade in the summer should be adequate. Reddening of the leaves indicates too much light. Insufficient light and your plants will grow tall and leggy and have light green foliage. Two hours of morning sun is preferred; similar to cattleyas.

Potting Medium: we use No.3 Kiwi Bark with a little pumice added on flowering size plants. Smaller pots we add 50% No.2 bark to the mix.

Air Movement: Fresh air with a degree of air movement is preferred all year round.

Temperatures: They prefer temperatures ranging from 10-27°C but will survive at lower and higher temperatures. Make sure you protect them from frost.

Maintenance: Repot when they fill the pot with roots but try to avoid over-potting. Once a stem has flowered prune to $\frac{1}{2}$ it's length to encourage multiple shoots from the base of the plant. If leaves drop or blemish in the winter from too cold conditions, prune back in spring to promote new growths.

Pests and Diseases: Not a major issue. Watch out for scale, mealy bug and aphids and treat appropriately.

Cut Spikes: Flower spikes last well when cut - enjoy them in the vase.
