CULTURE QUESTIONS

Q. My cymbidium back bulbs are sprouting, what do I do?

A. Bury the bulb to a level equal to the base of the growth in your preferred potting medium. Once it is established and growing the growth can be removed from back bulb and potted up.

Q. When giving dried blood to cymbidium plants in February, do you give it to small plants?

A. Use only for plants you want (or expect) to flower next year.

Q. Would you put dried blood on dendrobiums as well?

A. In September use on dendrobiums, (4 parts dried blood, 1 part super phosphate, 1 part potash). This is a good growth booster.

Q. Gary wanted to know about growing small plants jammed together in pots. Why?

A. Plants together don't lose their water through evaporation as quickly as single plants and therefore they utelise their fertiliser more efficiently.

<u>GUEST SPEAKER</u> David Young—Sunrae Orchids

Dave also owns a winery called Drury Hills Wines, which specializes in wine, liquers and honey meads. The new winery will be opening in approximately July.

Sunrae Orchids have always grown their orchids in bark. They buy their bark from Napier and use No 4 bark for phalaenopsis, cymbidiums and dendrobiums, (No 4 is more like our No 3).

He grows a lot of dendrobiums and exports to Japan and America. These are mainly *speciosum* crosses. Ranger crossed with Anne's Rainbow gives a great range of colours and lovely shaped flowers. Dave had a collection of about 12 photos from this cross, all magnificent flowers from the same seed pod and all very different to each other. Elegant Heart crosses also give a good variety of flowers.

Dave also grows sarcochilus in a variety of colours. These are grown together with dendrobiums with 70% shade on the plastic houses. Sarcochilus flowers can last up to 3 months on a plant. Sarco Cherie produces lovely pink flowers with patterns.

Culture:

Dendrobiums and sarcochilus grown together are fed with less nitrogen than potash or potassium. This is because it helps thicken the canes and makes them stronger to carry flower spikes.

Sarcs like a little more light than dendrobs.

Plants need about 50mm room to grow around the pot and need to have pots that are flexible. Watering is done every second day with feeding at every watering. In April reduce watering in *speciosums* - but never 'dry them off'. A good wind flow is needed through the houses.

Attack' for any bug control. Spray before flower spikes form as they will be damaged.
