#### **GUEST SPEAKER—Leigh Leaity**

Leigh gave us a wonderful Power Point presentation and talk on sarcochilus, (Aussie natives) and a favourite orchid for all of us. She explained that they were epiphytes and lithophytes, enjoying growing on rocks and trees, therefore giving us the option of rafting onto slabs, rocks or in pots with No.3 bark and lots of drain-

Air movement is essential and if growing on rafts, give plenty of water in the summer and twice a week in winter. Allow potted plants to dry out before watering.

These orchids do not need to be in a glass house so are a very good starter orchid for new growers and prefer a north facing growing area.

Feed with a low nitrogen and high potassium fertilizer all year round. Repotting can be done anytime, but avoid the hottest and coldest times. Repot every 2 years.
