PALMERSTON NORTH UPDATE

Due to lack of space and time constraints. I wasn't able to put this in the Bulletin last month.

As most of you would know, a group of us, (Lee and Roy Neale, Mary Jones, Glenys MacRae, Anjo McKernan, Ann and Ken Morse, Chris Whitby and I) went to Palmerston North to set up our club display. Despite the rain, slips, floods and detours, all of us got there safely - as well as most of the plants! A very large specimen cymbidium, (whose growers shall remain anonymous) had a roller coaster ride on the way there, having tipped over even before it got over the Harbour Bridge, and twice more on the way there. In the end it just got there minus a couple of spikes!

I was very pleased with the response to our call for plants, as we had plenty to fill our 3m x 6m display and still had a few plants to lend to the NZOS and Canterbury Orchid Societies.

Being very conservative we were initially worried our display and plants might not be up to scratch for an International Show.

Our fears were soon allayed after judging. Out of the 63 plants that we brought, 24 had won certificates. Part of this success was attributed to the way the display had shown each plant to its best potential. Special thanks go to Roy and his team for coming up with the well thought out design. The display travelled well and was easy to put up. It was also at very low cost. Although we did not get a placing for the display, it was one of the most photographed in the show.

Most of the set up crew left mid week and we were then joined by the knock down crew, (Linda and Melvin Alexander, Barry Baxter and Hugh Fraser).

We also had flying visits from a few other members, (Pauline Weeks, Betty Major,

William and Man Lo, Heather and Gary Cooke).

It was literally a flying visit for Pauline as it was her first time in an aircraft. Well done Pauline!

Overall, I think everyone had a good time. People were leaving with armloads full of plants and flasks from the traders.

We even went out to dinner with guest speakers, Norito Hasegawa and Dennis Diehm.
