
Guest Speaker: Leigh Leaity will be talking on sarcochilus.

GRAHAME LEAFBERG - Rafting

Materials Grahame suggested to use were: Hard black punga with an open weave, Australian jarrah, pumice, kwila, cork, driftwood and even a scouring pad!

His theory is very simple. Choose the material and tie the plant on!

Grahame rafted an oncidium to demonstrate. He put the plant directly on the raft and covered the roots with sphagnum moss, (coconut fibre is good also). He then secured it using a fine stainless steel wire. Nylon stockings cut to strips can also be used. Make sure the plant is tied firmly.

In summer he waters and fertilizes them every second day and if it is windy, then they may need more water. Hang warmer species high. Sarcochilus can be hung much lower as they are cooler growing and are a good orchid to begin your rafting adventure with.

Grahame very generously donated 2 rafted plants to the raffle table.

Thanks Grahame, you are always inspiring.

Next day I added another 3 rafts to my growing collection of rafted plants! ED.
